Greetings,

I read an article recently that warrants repeating. Perhaps this is some food for thought as you enter this new and exciting year. A year filled with possibilities and room for goals and dreams.

*“Have you ever been told that what you are striving for is not within your reach? If so, do you believe them and alter your dreams or goals?”*

Throughout the centuries, people of various walks of life, have been told that they have no chance to succeed. In a lot of cases, many people cower from these kinds of comments and start to believe that they cannot succeed, or that they do not have the intelligence or where-with-all to accomplish a goal or a dream.

If you choose to believe these types of comments, often times you are engaging in what is often referred to as a self-fulfilling prophecy, or, in other words, you start to believe what others say rather than believing in yourself and the gifts that God bestows in your life.”

Fortunately for her, though, she did not want to totally give up her idea. And, while she continued to have nagging doubts about what she really wanted to do, her goal was totally supported by a new business acquaintance.

Her business acquaintance gave her encouragement, made time available whenever she had questions or needed suggestions, or just to talk about business issues. And, though she had all the right plans and the ability to succeed, she remained her own worst obstacle. The good news is that she continued even though she struggled with self-doubt. In the end she persevered, and quit her day job to go it alone last year.

What she conquered was more than issues around developing her business; she conquered her own apprehension, her own self-doubt. She succeeded because she did not listen to the naysayers; she succeeded because she overcame the greatest obstacle – her own belief in herself. A belief that was strengthened through her willingness to see more in her own abilities.

God blesses each and every one of us so richly. But, sometimes I too feel we question or doubt our own abilities and so we stop ourselves short of where we might otherwise be able to go. May this New Year be an opportunity for us to hear God's call in our lives; may it be a chance for us to dream and to reach the goals that we set. Blessings as we welcome 2016!!

## January is National Mentoring Month

National Mentoring Month was created in 2002 by the Harvard School of Public Health and MENTOR: The National Mentoring Partnership. National Mentoring Month focuses national attention on the need for mentors. It also calls attention to how each of us as individuals, businesses, government agencies, schools, faith communities, and nonprofits can work together to increase the number of mentors needed to assure positive outcomes in the lives of our young people.

National Mentoring Month celebrates mentoring and the positive effect it can have on young lives. It is the perfect time to recognize the mentors and prayer partners who have been faithfully volunteering in our KIDS HOPE USA mentoring program. The mentors go to Drake Elementary School for one hour each week to work with their mentees. The behind-the-scene prayer partners hold the mentors and their mentees up in prayer. This combination has produced amazing, positive results in the lives of these young people in our community.
